

When a Medal session is arranged, it really takes the form of a small show, as an audience is a necessary part of taking a Medal. A programme is arranged with the pupils being put into sections according to age and dance. Each pupil in that particular section performs her/his dance and at the end an examiner has a word with each pupil about their performance and presents the comment sheet and Medal. A Certificate is forwarded on from Head Office within 6 weeks.

AWARDS

Triple, Graduate, Challenge Shields and Scholarships

Triple Awards	These are given to pupils gaining three Preparatory and Primary Examinations.
Graduate Awards	These are given to pupils gaining three Grade 1 Examinations.
Challenge Awards	Awarded to anyone gaining a Grade 5 in any subject.

SCHOLARSHIP DAY is held every year. Students eligible to apply must have reached and taken Grade 2 standard. They must apply on a correct form from Head Office.

There has been misunderstanding in the past as to qualifications for scholarships, don't think you can just take a Grade 2 Examination or be an outstanding dancer. These scholarships are given to potential, hard working students, someone who has worked through the Grades and the examiners prefer these students to be working on more than one subject.

A financial reward towards Examination fees is possible for qualifying students.

EXAMINATIONS

Examinations are an essential part of a dancing school curriculum. By taking Examinations a pupil's progress may be followed and parents then know their children are in fact gaining knowledge and not just attending week after week with no ultimate gain in view.

When a child is ready for an Examination she/he will be given a form stating which Examination she/he is to take, fees and date. The fees should then be paid in an envelope clearly marked with the pupil's name, age, Examination to be taken and amount of fees enclosed, no later than one month before the Exam session, and placed into the lesson money box.

ROSE AWARDS

Pupils from the age of three up to and including ten years can take these awards. These act as a stepping stone to the comprehensive graded system.

Pupils are entered in groups of up to four and will be assisted by the teacher or student teacher as if they were in a class situation.

Successful pupils will each receive a comment sheet, a Silver Mounted Cup will be awarded for Level 1 and a Gold Mounted Cup awarded for Level 2, followed by a Certificate issued from Head Office within six weeks.

CRYSTAL AWARDS

The Crystal awards give older students the opportunity to enhance their performance skills and can act as an encouragement between Graded examinations.

Successful candidates will each receive a certificate and a Glass trophy

After all the fees have been paid in, Head office will arrange a programme. Most Examinations are taken in sets of threes, a copy of the programme will be put on the notice board and each pupil can check the time of her/his Examination from this. It is necessary for pupils to be at the Examination at least 45 minutes before her/his allotted time, so that teachers may check their dress and answer any last minute questions. Dress for an Examination is very important, please make sure underwear does **NOT** show, and jewellery or make-up is **NOT** worn as these points will lose marks.

Parents are not allowed into the Examination room, this is one of the differences between Medals and Examinations. Exam results are sent to the dance school approximately 6 weeks after the Exams are taken.

If a pupil cancels an Examination or Medal test, no refund of fees is made. On production of a medical certificate, the Exam can be transferred to the schools next session.

MEDALS

The B.T.D.A. Medal System was introduced to encourage students in Stage Work. Taking a Medal is very different from taking an Examination. Medals are performed in costume and with make-up in front of an audience.

The order in which Medals are taken is as follows: -

The Medals are engraved with the subject being taken.

I feel taking Medals encourages the pupils and helps to give them an individual personality, develops their performance skills and gives them the experience of working to an audience.
